

Canyon Race A Winner

The 2021 Blackwater Canyon Half Marathon was a winner for runners, trail communities, and the Highlands Trail Foundation.

The race brought 114 runners from West Virginia and 11 other states, including Hawaii, Wisconsin, and Mississippi, to experience this unique event on Sept. 11. Other racers chased but could not catch local athlete Lucas Warner of Hendricks, who held his winning title with a time of one hr., 13 min., 39 sec. In fifth place overall, our female champion Sarah Thompson of Capon Bridge came in with an impressive time of one hr., 33 min., 4.7 sec.

In addition to showcasing the beautiful Blackwater Canyon and celebrating the joy of running, the BCHM has brought long-lasting benefits to the HTF and trail communities. Proceeds from the 2019 race allowed us to initiate an endowment to support area trails (see Highlands Trail Foundation Fund, p. 2). And for the first time in our more than 25-year history, we have secured insurance to cover events year-round. This will give us the freedom to do more activities such as impromptu bike rides, cross country ski outings, and volunteer work parties. Visit our Facebook page for information and updates.

Run For It

At 16 participants, the Highlands Trail Foundation's 2021 Run For It team was the largest to date. This year was once again a virtual run or walk. Team Captain Mary Boyd said participants raised \$327 in registration fees and donations. The Tucker Community Foundation has many sponsors who also support the event. The HTF received \$350 from the Randolph County Commission and \$200 from "The Luck of the Draw." The total raised for the Highlands Trail Foundation Fund was more that \$900. The TCF invests the money to help grow our fund and support future trail maintenance and development.
